


Claughton Cross Lancashire



Claughton Cross

According to Paul Conlon:

Wayside cross restored by William Fitzherbert-Brockholes in memory of his 2 sons and all from Claughton who gave their lives the Great War. The dedication is on a metal plaque on the front face. The stone base of the cross was pre-existing, hence the name of the neighbouring farm of Cross House Farm. The previous cross was wooden. The cross is a replica of a Celtic cross dug up in 1807 in Lancaster Parish Churchyard, now in the British Museum. It was covered with Celtic rope work, ending in a dragon's head.

another record adds:

Plaque attached to the base of the cross at Claughton on Brock This ancient wayside cross has been rebuilt as a private war memorial. The stone base is ancient and has been in its current position for some considerable time but the cross is a replica. It is from the cross that the neighbouring farm (Cross House) takes its name.

The two sons described in the text of the plaque are listed in the Commonwealth War Graves Commission as:


THOMAS JOSEPH FITZHERBERT-BROCKHOLES Captain (Adjt) Rifle Brigade, age 27 date of death 14/03/1915; he is buried in the communal cemetery at Estaires, a town in the Department of the Nord, about 11 kilometres west of Armentières.

ROGER HUBERT FITZHERBERT-BROCKHOLES Lieutenant Royal Navy HMS "Glory". Date of death 02/07/1919, Chief Mining Officer to the Relief Expedition. Sons of Son of William Fitzherbert-Brockholes CBE and Blanche Fitzherbert-Brockholes, of Claughton Hall, Garstang, Lancs.

Lt. Roger Hubert Fitzherbert-Brockholes

Killed in Action - 2 July 1919

Son of William Fitzherbert-Brockholes, C.B.E., of Claughton Hall, Garstang, Lancashire, and Blanche, 2nd daughter of Maj. Gen. the Hon. Sir Henry Clifford, V.C., K.C.M.G. Chief Mining Officer to the Relief Expedition.

Roger was assigned to the battleship "HMS Glory", serving as the flagship of the British North Russia Squadron during the Allied intervention in the Russian Civil War. This battleship was usually in Murmansk whilst various operations were being carried out elsewhere. His record states that he died whilst carrying out mine sweeping operations in the Dvina River North Russia. It is highly unlikely that a battleship would be able to navigate this river.

In actual fact, Roger was onboard a hospital barge when a mine was sighted. He immediately jumped into a skiff that was alongside and reached the mine before it could do any damage. In the act of securing it the mine exploded, killing him and the three other men who were with him in the skiff.

The below cuttings are from the Supplement to the London Gazette, 19 May 1920:

6. It was necessary to explore channels with small steamboate, clear mines where discovered, buoy a passage, and then send up the heavier-draught tunnel mine-sweepers to sweep up the heavier and deeper-moored mines. The whole of the work had to be carried out within range of the enemy flotilla, and the mine-tweeping craft were daily exposed to heavy fire from his guns, and at times even came under direct machine-gun and rifle fire.

 The exploratory sweeping in steamboats was most gallantly performed by parties of British seamen and the Russian boats' crews under the orders of Lieutenant R. H. Fitzherbert-Brockholes, R.N., and Lieutenant C. E. McLaughlin, R.N. The tunnel mine-sweepers were under the command of Lieu-

tenant A. K. McC. Halliley, R.N.
8. I cannot speak too highly of the gallantry and devotion to duty displayed by the mine-sweeping party in their tareless endeavours to clear the river for the safe navigation of the flotilla and water transport.

Their efforts were crowned with success after a week's most arduous work, and over 40 mines had been cleared from the river. This had not been achieved, however, without the loss of the mine-sweeper "Sword Dance," which was mined and sunk on 24th June. Subsequently a second mine-sweeper, the "Fan-dango," also struck a mine and was lost.

15. Floating mines and net defences.-The enemy now endeavoured to damage the flotilla

by floating mines down on to it.

One of these mines was sighted very early on the morning of the 2nd July approaching the hospital barge. Lieutenant R. H. Fitz-herbert-Brockholes, R.N., jumped out of his bunk and into a skiff which happened to be alongside and reached the mine before it could do any damage. He was in the act of securing it, when it exploded, instantly killing him and the three men forming the crew of the boat.


The death of this very gallant young officer was a great loss to the flotilla.


All ships promptly set to work, and in a few days a complete net defence had been laid out above the flotilla anchorage.
